1. Artist: Karel Appel Karel

Appel (1921 – 2006) was a Dutch sculptor and ceramicist.

Karel studied at the State Academy in Amstersam from 1940 to 1943. After World War II, he worked with drawings issued by children. He moved to Paris in 1950 where his paintings took on grotesque features in the form of animals, monsters and people. His paintings also consisted of dynamic shapes and strong colours.



(1939 – 2010) was a Swedish illustrator, painter, graphic designer, sculptor, author and advertising artist.

His art consists of imaginative, ornate patterns where the small parts of the pattern consist of small figures arranged in parades or other formations, as well as humorous compositions made up of a fantasy architecture reminiscent of American poster art. Kjell also created the official poster for the East Indiaman Götheborg in 2000 and he has also made himself known in Gothenburg through his miniatures.

3. Artist: Lajos Flesser,

Born in 1937 in Budapest. In 1956, at the age of 19, he fled from Hungary to Sweden. He came via Helsingør-Helsingborg and the refugee camp in first Mölle and then Uddevalla. Flesser's painting is characterized by a peculiar palette knife technique. This peculiar technique effectively evokes the strange, dreamlike symbolism of the works, with figures appearing that are connected to each other and with a space behind them, often filled with floating butterflies.

4. Artist: Olle Langert

Nils Olof (Olle) Langert (11 June 1924 – 21 December 2016) was a Swedish illustrator, graphic artist, painter and sculptor. The road to art was not straight. He graduated from high school as World War II was coming to an end and wanted to get out and see the world as quickly as possible. He therefore went to sea by signing on a cargo ship that carried him between Gothenburg-Valencia-Barcelona-Cuba-New York. When Olle was back in Gothenburg, he began studying at a painting school called Valand – but his apprenticeship was short. After a school trip to Amsterdam, he went on to Rome and Florence and then remained in Paris for two years (1946-1947).



5. Artist: Torsten Esbjörnsson

(1925 – 2012) was a Swedish visual artist and graphic artist who was characterized by **strong colors and graphic shapes.**

He studied at the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts in Copenhagen, as well as at Mogens Andersén's oppositional art school. In the 1960s, he began to work with an optical, non-figurative imagery with the square and the circle of basic elements reflected in the painting we have on our wall.

7. Artist: Olle Nyman

(1909 – 1999) was a Swedish painter, sculptor and textile artist. Olle studied at the Royal Academy of Fine Arts in Stockholm from 1929 to 1934 with Olle Hjortzberg. With cubism as a starting point, Olle has developed a string of restrained pictorial form with melodically well-tuned colour tones, often against a grey base tone.



Netherlands, Belgium and Germany. For a time, he lived in France and took the opportunity to study at the Académie Julian in Paris. She made her debut during a solo exhibition in Lidköping in 1957 and subsequently held several solo exhibitions, including at Läckö Castle. 41. Artist: Sven Jonson

In 1922 he began to paint more artistically and in 1925 he began studying at Wilhelmson's painting school in Stockholm. In 1927, the combined painting school and studio Modern Reklam was opened together with Esaias Thorén, the studio became a gathering place for all artists in Halmstad. Sven is characterized by desolate landscapes in light yellow and brown tones, often also with human figures. During the last part of Sven's oeuvre, a blue colour scheme dominated, often with motifs that reflected his interest in space, the constellations and the planets - perhaps something can be glimpsed in the painting on our wall?
